- We visited the "Learning Lab" this week for writing where students were able to sketch what they saw in nature and use their sketch as a way to generate ideas for writing!

## Here is what we have been learning...

Reading: We have continued working on fix-up reading strategies for when they come to unknown words. This week we began a comprehension strategy called "Questioning". Students learned that good readers ask questions before, during, and after they read to check for understanding. We practiced this strategy during our whole group lessons each day this week and they also did so during their daily 5 centers. At home, be sure to have your child ask those "who, what, where, when, why, how, etc" questions before, during, and after they read. By now, we have reviewed and gone over the expectations for all the daily 5 centers. Next week, we will be practicing the full rotation of what they are doing as I am preparing to begin guided reading groups. In phonics we began working with "short a" and Mrs. King came and did her lesson on Tuesday. Next week we will be working with "short e". This week, our vocabulary word was opinion and next week it will be energetic. Please be sure to be reviewing these words with your child!

Writing: We've started our first unit, which focuses on generating ideas from a sketch. Students had multiple opportunities to sketch and then write a story based on their sketch. We have also been focusing on using capital letters, writing neatly, and using ending marks! Please remind your child to write with proper conventions when doing his/her "Home Fun". Next week we will start getting ideas from real life events that have happened to us.

Math: We have continued to work on addition and subtraction fact strategies. We learned about "fact families/related facts", "doubles", and "doubles +1 " facts. We have also continued to work with story problems and composing and decomposing numbers! As I explained during Parent Night, a huge component of Common Core math is to be able to explain and show your thinking and students are becoming more comfortable with this expectation the more we practice! We have finished our first unit and will be taking our first math assessment next Tuesday. We will review in class on Monday the concepts we have been working on for the past 4 weeks, but please review with your child as well. I am so happy to see - how many students are working on xtramath.org at home! The daily practice with math facts is greatly helping your child with their math fact fluency! We will continue going to the computer lab weekly to practice.
Social Studies: We learned about Labor Day and why we had the day off. We read non-fiction stories that explained the history behind this holiday. We discussed the importance of different workers within our community and the tools they use. Students wrote about what job they want when they grow up. The next two weeks will focus on rural, urban, and suburban sommunities
