It is hard to believe, but we will be finishing the first quarter next Friday, October 11th. This first quarter has flown by and I love learning more and more about your children with each new day of school! Report cards will be sent home on October 23rd. Please keep in mind for this first quarter that many of the concepts being assessed have just been introduced and will be taught in greater detail throughout the year in order to meet the year-end standard. Here is what we have been learning...

Reading: We have been busy reading non-fiction stories and learning about the different text features found in these books. Some text features we have been focusing on that help us better understand nonfiction stories are: Table of Contents, Glossary, Bold Words, Headings, Captions, Diagrams, Maps, and Photographs and Illustrations. Be sure to ask your child what these are, how do they help, and where can they be found! Students have been building their reading skills with informational text both in whole group, small group, and independently. We have also begun learning about Authors Purpose. Students are learning how to decide if the author's purpose is to "persuade", "inform", or "entertain". A helpful acronym I taught them is to think of P.I.E. We will expand upon this skill next week and work on finding evidence within the text to support our decision of what the purpose is. We have finished reviewing short vowel sounds.

Writing: We have continued with our unit on narrative writing. Last week we wrote silly animal stories as part of our Being a Writer curriculum. We began by generating basic sentences and then formulating a story based on one sentence. This week we wrote scary stories! Students worked on adding descriptive words such as sound words. Next week. we will learn about the writing process of revising and publishing. We will also begin writing about a fictional monster! The students love our Halloween inspired writing topics! In an effort to improve the quality of writing, we have started "5 Star" assessments. These will be given weekly and will show whether students are writing with the 5 grade level conventions such as: capitals, punctuation, spacing, letter formation, and spelling. You should have seen the first one come home this week! Please work with your child on their handwriting at home!

Math: We finished our 2nd unit on Place Value and took the district assessment! I should hopefully have those returned early next week. Please review it with your child and take note of what skills he or she may need more assistance with. Please continue to review any skills that were not mastered, as I will be reassessing throughout the year! As part of our review, we played some really fun math games such as: guess the mystery number off the 100 chart, human place value game, and silent pass the paper skip counting. Be sure to ask your child which was their favorite and maybe play it with them at home! Our next unit will be "Telling Time". Within this unit we will focus on telling time to the 5-minute and determining the difference between A.M. and P.M. I encourage you to practice with your child at home telling time both on an analogue clock as well as on a digital clock. Please continue daily practice with math facts!

Social Studies: We have continued learning about map skills. Next week we will learn about globes and briefly touch on the equator, oceans, and continents. We will apply all the skills by making pirate maps! We will then switch to Science and our unit on "Energy".
