## Here is what we have been learning...

Reading: I have finished formally assessing all students and I am pleased with the increase in reading levels compared to the beginning of the year. I will be reviewing where your child is according to the new district rubric during conferences. The past two weeks we have been focusing on dictionary skills and context clues. These two strategies are used when trying to identify what an unknown word means. Students learned how to navigate through an actual dictionary as well as an online one. They learned about guidewords and synonyms and antonyms.
They also learned to use the context clues within a sentence or paragraph to help them with what unknown words mean. Often, context clues come before or after the word in the form of a synonym, antonym, explanation, or example. Be sure to ask your child to identify unknown words at home and find context clues to help them. Over the next month, we will begin our study of fables and folktales. The next two weeks we will read many different Aesop's fables and identify the characters, setting, and what the moral or lesson learned is.

Writing: We continue to work on adding more detail to our writing. Students wrote 2 short stories this week about a pet they'd like to get, and a fictional character they created and the adventure of this character! You will be able to review their writing during conferences. Next week, we will do a fun Thanksgiving week-long writing lesson where students take the perspective of a turkey and write a persuasive letter to a human why they should not be eaten. Although, we cover persuasive writing later on in the year, this is a fun introduction to this style of writing!

Math: We have continued learning how to add and subtract within 100. The past two weeks we have worked specifically with subtraction. This operation has proved to be more difficult than 2digit addition for many. I am seeing lots of simple mathematical errors with basic math facts, which in turn effects the final answer, regardless if they were doing the right steps. As part of the common core rigor, students will need to be able to explain their reasoning of how they solve 2-digit math problems and show visual drawings as well. Please spend some extra time working with 2-digit subtraction with trading at home. Our unit 4 assessment is planned for next Thursday, November $21^{\text {st }}$. We will review all skills next week and learn our last skill, which involves adding 3, 2-digit numbers. Please continue daily practice with math facts!

Science: We have been having so much fun with our energy unit! Last week we learned about matter (solid, liquid, and gas). This week we had a blast experimenting with heat energy. Students learned their body acts as a source of heat. Ask them what we did with ice cubes and Hershey kisses! Next, week will take a break from Science, to learn about Thanksgiving and Native Americans.
