Here is what we have been learning...

Reading: We finished reviewing the strategy of inferring. Students are expected to infer in small group as well as whole group and I'm happy to see them applying this strategy that strengthens their comprehension as well as increases their level of engagement. This week we did an author study on Dr. Seuss. In celebrating his books as well as his birthday this month. I thought i'd he next to have a birthday this month, I thought it'd be neat to have an all-encompassing mini-unit on his life. We learned about his childhood years, how he obtained his occurred throughout his life. Be sure to ask your child to tell you 3 facts about Theodore Geisel (aka Dr. Seuss). After spring break, we will begin our next strategy, which is called "synthesizing". When synthesizing, students are activating their higher level thinking skills and making changes to their thinking as a story progresses. For example, they may start off by a story progresses. For example, they may start off by saying "at first I was thinking", but later on they may say "after learning__, I now think__". We will work on this strategy for the month of April. As you have seen with Words Their Way, we've been studying rcontrolled words as well as silent consonants. Be sure to ask your child what some of the silent consonants are! We will focus on past tense endings such as "ed"

Writing: We have been busy working on expository reports! Each week we spend the beginning of the week previewing our next topic, reviewing the 4 parts of an expository essay, and doing some shared writing. The remainder of the week is a writers workshop model where students are given time to independently write while I pull students to conference with. When conferencing with each student, I review what they've worked on, check for conventions, and offer structural or content-related advice to strengthen their writing. Last week, students wrote an expository report about how to catch a sneaky leprechaun. This week, they wrote an expository report about the qualities that make a great pet sitter! Many of the students are able to independently write an expository essay from start to finish with little to no assistance. We will be taking a break from expository essays for a little white after spring break to start our next unit on poetry. We will learn about the different styles of poetry for several weeks and then revisit expository writing in order to start our animal reports! The students are already looking forward to these and can't wait to see which animal they get to research and write about!

Math: We have started our new unit on "Measurement". Students learned they can measure length, height, width, weight, temperature, and capacity. They used their rulers to measure items using the units of feet, inches, and centimeters. We also measured larger items using a yardstick and meter stick. We had a blast going on a measurement scavenger hunt in the classroom, measuring different parts our body, and measuring a gummy worm! We will be spending about 3 weeks after break on this unit, and going deeper into concepts. Be sure to ask your child what unit of measurement they would use for certain items to see if they know the difference in size. <u>Please spend some time with your child over spring</u> <u>break practicing their addition and subtraction math</u> <u>facts.</u> So many of them are very close for subtraction, and I'd like to see them reach 50 before the end of the year, as this is the 2nd grade target.

Science: This week we started our next Science unit on "Biomes". We learned about the Prairie/Grasslands and what plants and animals live here as well as the characteristics of this biome. After break we will review Grasslands and begin learning about the Desert.
