Looking forward, I want to mention several things coming up! First, our class will be starting a "Flat Stanley" letter writing project at the end of this month that will be part of our next writing unit, which covers friendly letter writing. ## Midterms/Assembly

AimsWeb progress reports will be sent home on Friday, January 31st. The charts will show a snapshot of your child's growth in reading and math. We will also have a fun school-wide assemlby that day!

### Here is what we will be learning...

**Reading:** During the month of January, we will be reviewing previously learned comprehension strategies such as comparing and contrasting two similar stories, questioning, author's purpose, and identifying the main idea of singular and multiparagraph passages. We will review elements of these strategies that we learned earlier in the year, and then expand our knowledge and understanding of them even more! We will continue to practice applying these strategies with both fiction and nonfiction stories. Additionally, we will be reviewing all of our Daily 5 expectations to start the year off on the right reading foot! These are the independent activities your child is doing while I am reading with a small group of students. Our phonics focus this week is "c says, g says". We will also review the sounds of "y". As mentioned before, students are expected to be applying the phonics strategies when they read as well as when they write.

**Writing:** This week we will be reading "Snowy Day" and writing our own snowy day stories. Students will be reflecting on their prior experiences of a snowy day and which activities they enjoyed doing and the sequence in which they occurred. These will be displayed in the hallway once we finish them, and they will make their way home in a few weeks for you to read! We will also spend some time reviewing conventions and writing expectations such as complete sentences, using capitals and ending marks, and using our neatest handwriting. Now that we are in the second half of the year, I fully expect students to be following these writing rules. Next week we will begin our letter-writing unit. We will learn the different components of a friendly letter, practice writing many different letters based on our Being a Writer curriculum, and then begin our Flat Stanley project towards the end of January. The idea of this project comes from the book *Flat Stanley* by Jeff Brown, which we will be reading and discussing in the coming weeks. Please think of what friends or relatives your son or daughter can mail their "Flat Stanley" to If possible that think of someone in Stanley" to. If possible, try to think of someone in different states or countries! They may mail more than one. More information will be sent out on this project, but I wanted to allow you time to start preparing.

Math: We will be starting our next math unit this week titled "Reasoning With Shapes". I have typed up another parent common core guide for this unit to up another parent common core guide for this unit to help you better understand the topics, vocabulary, and types of problems your child will be learning about. This week we will be focusing on exploring 2D shapes. Students will be learning about polygons, quadrilaterals, triangles, and the difference between a rectangle and square. Next week, we will continue to learn all about 2D shapes and fractions (halves, thirds, fourths). This unit should be about 2 and half weeks long. Please remember to practice math facts with your child nightly, especially after the break! We will continue to review at school by going to the computer lab to practice xtramath.org, using drill computer lab to practice xtramath.org, using drill donut sheets, and other fun math fact fluency games!

Social Studies: We will be spending 2 weeks learning about important historical figures. A few historical figures we will be learning about are: Harriet Tubman, Martin Luther King Jr., Rosa Parks, and Alexander Graham Bell. After the two weeks, we will switch hash to Science and begin our animal. will switch back to Science and begin our animal unit! We will be learning about five different classes of animals. This is such a fun unit and I know the students will love it!
